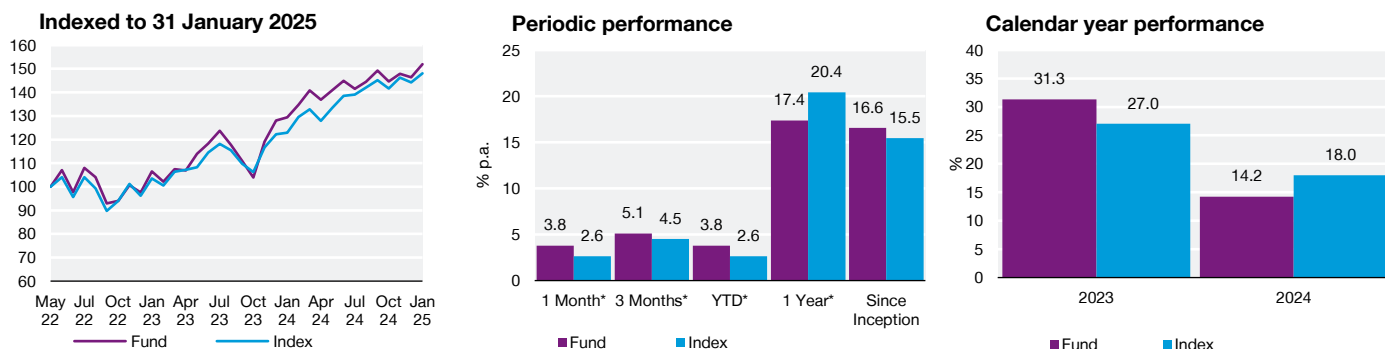

Investment proposition

The Worldwide Islamic Global Equities Fund aims to produce long-term returns by investing in a concentrated portfolio of Sharia-compliant stocks, constructed with little regard to an index. The Fund adopts a long-term time horizon of five years and beyond and positioning is based on bottom-up stock selection. Along with our growth investment philosophy we look for companies that meet Sharia principles as interpreted and laid down by the Sharia Supervisory Board and the relevant environmental, social and governance criteria. We exclude companies that do not, at a minimum, meet the fundamental responsibilities of the United Nations Global Compact Principles for Business and are inconsistent with Sharia principles. The Fund's investment managers draw on a combination of their own ideas and that of other investment teams at Baillie Gifford to construct a portfolio of between 30 to 50 companies.

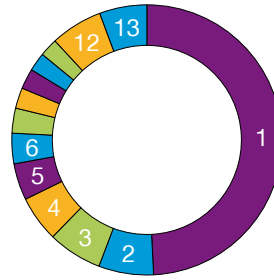

The Fund is suitable for all investors seeking a fund that aims to deliver long-term capital growth by investing in companies who comply with Sharia principles and focus on positive societal impact. The Fund considers sustainability preferences through a minimum proportion of sustainable investments and the qualitative consideration of principal adverse impacts using an exclusionary approach. Investors should be prepared to bear losses. The Fund is compatible for mass market distribution. The Fund may not be suitable for investors concerned about short term volatility and performance, seeking a regular source of income and investing for less than five years. The Fund does not offer capital protection.

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
